


**NOTICE OF CANCELLATION OF THE SANDY
SUBURBAN IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT 2017
LOCAL ELECTION**

Under Utah law, if only one candidate files a declaration of candidacy for an elective board member position and there are no properly compliant write-in candidates, a local district board may cancel an otherwise required local district election in accordance with UTAH CODE ANN. § 20A-1-206(3) and consider the properly declared candidate elected to the open board member position as long as the following conditions are met: (1) there are no other local district ballot propositions, and (2) the local district governing body adopts a resolution no earlier than sixty (60) days prior to the day of the scheduled election and no later than at least twenty (20) days prior to the day of the scheduled election that: (a) cancels the election, (b) certifies that there is only one candidate for each open at-large local district office, and (c) considers the candidate elected to the open district office.

Sandy Suburban Improvement District's governing body, the Board of Trustees, hereby certifies that there is only one open, at-large local district office for the 2017 regularly scheduled district election, to wit, one board member position, and that there is only one candidate for that office, namely Mark E. Hurst. The Board further certifies that there are no other local district ballot propositions for Sandy Suburban Improvement District.

On September 14, 2017, the Board of Trustees, by written resolution and based upon the above-certified candidacy circumstances, cancelled its November 7, 2017 regularly scheduled district election, and, pursuant to the authority granted it by UTAH CODE ANN. § 17B-1-306(4)(g), considered Mark E. Hurst elected to the one open Sandy Suburban board member position up for election in the 2017 election year.
